



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

A few of the Jurors of Stage 1, who are practicing architects had a few comments for the participating students:

- The students have submitted exceptional work. The topics chosen are innovative and out of the box and well thought-out with detailed explanations for every point to explain their work. Creating architectural interventions in these areas and subjects needed a different thinking approach. This is seen in the thought process. Most of the technical details were up to the mark.
- The work of dissertations were interestingly presented and we hope we see such works when these young budding architects come into practice.
 It was a good experience and evaluating the dissertations has helped in bridging the gap between students and practicing architects.
- One more aspect is seen in the selection of topics, is that students are sensitive towards society and its problems. They are trying to use architecture as a medium to solve these issues and create a better society.
- To be apositive some thesis tenies were small and may be considered

- The students may require to be guided regarding certain topics from the very start, as case studies in today's times becomes difficult for some of the topics.
- Another trend seen is that there is a very thin line in between an architect and urban planner. Many students have shown the capacity of not only an architect but in turn a good urban interventionist too.
- It is essential that they need to concentrate and develop architectural representations such as plans and sections than on 3D renders, walkthroughs and exploded isometrics.
- Very few students showed their hand-drawn sketches and bubble diagrams for the initial concept stage.
